Presentations	<p>CSUSB & San Bernardino County Sheriff – Chris Vallejo</p> <p>A. Parental Intervention Program</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Chris Vallejo introduced himself and talked about his work with the Parental Intervention Program. He passed out a questionnaire titled ACE or Adverse Childhood Experience. Talked about the three different types: Abuse, neglect, and household dysfunction. Chris said that ACEs have a detrimental effect on well-being and that this is an inter-generation issue. Chris stated that children raised by an adult with 1 or more ACE's are 1000x more likely to suffer their own adverse experience. - Chris talked about various solutions to this crisis, such as building/strengthening a child's resilience, healthy coping with psychological social distress, a strong sense of individuality and value, and healthy communication strategies. Chris stated that only through greater quality parenting based in warmth and empathy which will create a greater and more secure positive child guidance attachment can the cycle of abuse, neglect, and household dysfunction be ended once and for all. - Chris also talked about a program called TALK or Teaching and Loving Kids. He mentioned testimony about several participants who have undergone the process and whose lives have been positively transformed from it. Chris mentioned a woman who works for him as being a former participant when she was a child along with her mother and who now is a graduate student, whose mother has never returned to jail and whose life is infinitely better than it would have been had she not participated in the TALK program. 	<p>Community Outreach and Innovation</p> <p>B. Law Enforcement Perception Survey Results</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Pavneet Kaur talked about the results of the Law Enforcement Perception Survey that took place at the NIC conference and broke down the data of those who participated by demographic indicators such as race, age, and gender. Pavneet then stated around 75 percent of respondents were women, a plurality of 42 percent were Hispanic, and around 80 percent were between the ages of 25-64.- Pavneet then stated the survey asked them questions pertaining to their perception of law enforcement personnel such as “how would you describe your views of law enforcement?” and “how would you describe your encounters with police?” A majority of the respondents stated in these questions a positive outlook on law enforcement with nearly 95% of respondents stating they could call police if they needed help and nearly 90% stating they believe it would make the situation better. However when asked the question, “do you believe law enforcement individuals abuse their authority?” over 70% of those who answered stated that YES they believe law enforcement individuals do abuse their authority.- Pavneet then went over the final strand of data which asked respondents of the survey their familiarity with various terms and ballot propositions related to law enforcement and an overwhelming majority were not familiar with them at all. Only 48% of respondents knew what recidivism was, this was the highest out of all the questions pertaining to this topic. Respondents also were asked about their familiarity with law enforcement and faith based collaborations, the media and its coverage of law enforcement, and if they followed law enforcement on social media.
