

LOCAL ENFORCEMENT AGENCY (LEA) PROJECTS UPDATE – **OCTOBER 2010**

- Barstow Sanitary Landfill** – An application for a Full Solid Waste Facility Permit Revision was submitted on December 21, 2009 to expand the landfill footprint from 47 to 331 acres, increase the waste capacity, change the hazardous waste storage time, implement an Odor Impact Minimization Plan (OIMP), change the self-monitoring program reporting period from 15 to 30 days at the end of the reporting period, add language to incorporate the work plan for the Title 27 gas monitoring probes, and to allow storage of gypsum wallboard. The application package was accepted March 24, 2010 and the new Full Solid Waste Facility Permit was issued on July 27, 2010. (Barstow)
- City of Claremont** - An application for a registration permit was submitted to correct inconsistencies that were addressed during the facility's 5 year permit review. The registration permit application was accepted August 2, 2010. (Claremont.)
- IEUA RP-5 SHF/REEP Food Waste Anaerobic Digester** – An Enforcement Agency Notification was submitted to operate a Research Composting/Anaerobic Digestion operation in the City of Chino at the IEUA facility. The operation will use food waste as a feed stock at the existing anaerobic digesters located at the IEUA's RP-5 REEP facility. The purpose of the research operation will be to demonstrate that food waste is a viable feed stock for use in the IEUA anaerobic digesters for generation of economical quantities and quality bio-methane gas. (Chino on IEUA property.)
- Inland Empire Environmental Inc.** – An application for a new Full Solid Waste Facility Permit was submitted on January 25, 2010 to obtain a Full Solid Waste Facility Permit for a Large Volume Transfer/Processing Facility. The facility is proposing to be permitted for a maximum permitted daily tonnage of 900 tons per day and the maximum vehicle count will be 193 vehicles per day. The LEA accepted the application package on February 24, 2010. A public informational meeting was conducted on March 16, 2010. The LEA submitted the proposed permit to Cal Recycle on August 31, 2010. Cal Recycle is currently reviewing the proposed permit. (San Bernardino)
- Landers Sanitary Landfill** – An application for a Full Solid Waste Facility Permit Modification was submitted on November 6, 2009 to change the self-monitoring program reporting period from 15 to 30 days after the end of the reporting period and to eliminate condition D from the Solid Waste Facility Permit. The LEA accepted the application package on December 4, 2009. The new Solid Waste Facility Permit was issued on April 6, 2010. (Landers)
- Landers Sanitary Landfill** – An application for a Joint Technical Document Amendment was submitted on March 22, 2010 to allow gypsum wallboard to be stored on site. This amendment was accepted by the LEA on April 20, 2010. (Landers)
- Twentynine Palms Transfer Station** – An application for a Transfer Processing Report Amendment was submitted on July 28, 2010 to add a forklift and flatbed trailer for onsite operations to process recyclable materials. This amendment was accepted by the LEA on August 25, 2010. (Twentynine Palms)
- Victor Valley Material Recovery Facility** - An application for a Full Solid Waste Facility Permit Modification was submitted on November 2, 2009 to remove the hours of the buy-back center from the permit. The LEA accepted the application package on December 2, 2009. The new Solid Waste Facility Permit was issued on April 21, 2010. (Victorville)
- Victor Valley Regional Composting Facility** - An application for a Report of Composting Site Information Amendment was submitted on July 9, 2010 to add address various language changes in regards to the new operator name, odor impact minimization plan and new schematic drawings. This amendment was accepted by the LEA on July 20, 2010. (Victorville)
