**SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY AIRPORTS COMMISSION MEETING  
April 26, 2012**

The meeting of the San Bernardino County Airports Commission was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Chairman, Jim Bagley. Meeting location: Planes of Fame Air Museum Theater, 7000 Merrill Avenue, Chino, CA 91710.

**Report on Posting of Agenda:**

James E. Jenkins, Director of Airports, stated the agenda was posted in accordance with requirements.

**Awards, Guest Introductions and Announcements – James E. Jenkins, Director of Airports:**

Terry L. Stover, Assistant Director of Airports presented Airport Maintenance Worker Randall Lee with a 30 year service pin.

**Approval of Minutes:**

Vice Chair Larry Asmus moved (seconded by Commissioner William Smith) to approve the Minutes of March 22, 2012. Motion carried.

**Commissioners Reports/Comments:**

Vice Chair Asmus referred to the flyer advertising Wild Willie's Smokehouse at the Apple Valley Airport and stated the information provided was encouraging.

Commissioner Ray Marquez thanked Brian Boyer for hosting the meeting.

Chair Bagley commented that he was looking forward to the Chino Air Show. Mr. Jenkins inquired if the Commissioners had received their packets with Air Show tickets. The Commissioners responded that the packets had been received.

**Public Comments:**

Brian Boyer of the Planes of Fame gave an overview of the Chino Air Show and the scheduled performers. Mr. Boyer expressed his appreciation to the Chino Valley Fire District and Mr. Jenkins, Mr. Stover and staff for their help.

Bob Velker introduced himself as a longtime Volunteer of the Planes of Fame Air Museum who is currently helping Mr. Jenkins with his Advisory Committee.

A.J. Ursic briefed on the Certified Flight Instructor (CFI) briefing, the Federal Aviation Administration Safety Team (FAAST) meeting and the User's Group.

**Information Item: Department Updates**

Mr. Stover updated on Wild Willie's Smokehouse and their anticipated opening of May 1, 2012 at the Apple Valley Airport (APV).

Mr. Stover stated that APV is hosting the International Aerobatic Club (IAC) contest on May 3 through 5, 2012. Mr. Stover described the contest and added that the event has been held annually at APV for the last seven or eight years. Mr. Stover stated that the event is not publicized but he does encourage the public to come and spectate.

**Discussion Item: APV Security Gate Access Project – Terry L. Stover, Acting Assistant Director**

Mr. Stover stated that the APV Security Gate Access Project is complete with four new security gates with operators and key card access similar to the Chino Airport (CNO) gate system. Mr. Stover described the gate systems functions and capabilities. Commissioner Bob Cable suggested embossing tenant photos on the gate cards as a way to enhance security.

**Discussion Item: TNP Security Camera and Signage Project – Terry L. Stover, Acting Assistant Director**

Mr. Stover referred to tab six of the packet and stated the first photo showed signs that have been posted at the Twentynine Palms Airport (TNP) reading "WARNING THESE PREMISES ARE SECURED BY ELECTRONIC ALARM & CLOSED CIRCUIT T.V. SYSTEMS". Mr. Stover referred to the next photo which showed the game cameras that have been installed at TNP overlooking the east ramp area. Mr. Stover stated that photos have already been reviewed from the cameras and circulated to the Commission following an incident that occurred at TNP during the weekend of April 21, 2012. Mr. Stover stated that a fourth camera will be installed. Chair Bagley described his ongoing issue of fuel theft from his aircraft at TNP and stated that he appreciated the extra camera. Chair Bagley described serious safety issues that could be resultant of fuel theft.

Chair Bagley stated that it is common knowledge that the gates at TNP can be held open with a garbage can placed five feet away from the gate sensor. Mr. Jenkins responded that the issue will easily be resolved using spare parts from the APV gate system that was phased out, making the system "card in, card out".

**Monthly Updates:**

**Capital Improvement Program – Carrie Hyke, Airport Planner**

Airports Planner, Carrie Hyke stated the APV fuel facility plans have been approved by Architecture and Engineering, "in house experts" and the Apple Valley Fire Protection District.

Ms. Hyke stated that there will be a Board item so that the project can be set up for bid.

Ms. Hyke stated that Architecture and Engineering has issued a Notice to Procure regarding the Barstow-Daggett Phase II Project in order to establish an escrow account so that the contractor can receive their bond.

Chuck McCormick with the Engineering Firm, Parsons Brinkerhoff stated that they held a recent meeting with the City of Chino regarding the Storm Water Project on Kimball Avenue. Mr. McCormick stated that the City made additional comments on the Mylar drawings provided to them and modifications will be made and resubmitted for their approval. Mr. McCormick stated that once approval is received from the City of Chino the item can go before the Board for bid approval.

**Board of Supervisors Activity – James E. Jenkins, Director of Airports:**

Mr. Jenkins stated that the Special Event License is in place and is being acted upon by the Planes of Fame. Mr. Jenkins added that the Fourth District Board Office was able to secure funds and assist the Planes of Fame in promoting the Air Show.

Mr. Jenkins explained the Chino Basin Watermaster process of controlling and treating the water in the basin. Mr. Jenkins stated that the County of San Bernardino is under an order (going back to 1990 and reissued in 2008) to clean up organic compounds that are in the ground water and emanating somewhere from CNO. Mr. Jenkins said that the County continues to respond to the Regional Water Quality Board's requirements to clean up the organics in the ground water. Mr. Jenkins said that at the end of March 2012 the County was cited by the Regional Water Quality Board with a notice of violation related to a system of wells that were required to be in place in order to report data by May 1, 2012. Mr. Jenkins added that the wells should have been in place last fall. Mr. Jenkins noted a number of causes for the violation, including lack of communication with the Regional Water Quality Board and failure to have an alternative plan for splitting up the phases for the drilling of the wells. Mr. Jenkins stated the fine could be up to \$5,000 per day. Mr. Jenkins stated the County Administrative Office is fully engaged in the process and are fully aware of what is transpiring and are providing oversight and assistance. Mr. Jenkins described the process of funding for the wells.

Mr. Jenkins described an Amendment of a Use to allow special events at hangars owned by Les Whittlesey at the north end of the tower at CNO.

Mr. Jenkins highlighted the fact that Commissioner Cable was going to be part of the Oversight Committee for the Upland Redevelopment Agency.

**Real Estate – James E. Jenkins, Director of Airports:**

Mr. Jenkins stated that he would let the Property Leasing Activity Report "stand on its own". Mr. Jenkins briefed on major delinquencies on the books.

**Finance – James E. Jenkins, Director of Airports:**

Mr. Jenkins apologized and stated that he has not figured out how to engage the Commission in the budget cycle due to the way the budget is established and the short windows of time that the County allows the Department of Airports for producing the budget documents. Mr. Jenkins stated that this budget cycle is horrendous for the County and particularly for the Department of Airports. Mr. Jenkins described County Utility charges (also known as Cal Cap charges), a bond payment and loss of immediate revenue. Mr. Jenkins noted significant cuts to the Department's operational structure, including staff positions eliminated from the books. Mr. Jenkins added that revenue is the concern, as it is what drives the process. Mr. Jenkins said that the financial report is not included in the packet as it does not create an accurate picture of

what is going on in the Department. Mr. Jenkins anticipated a financial report will be included in the June 28, 2012 Commission packet and added that revenues are solid relative to the base revenues. Chair Bagley stated that it is important that the Commission take a look at the financial expenditures and that per Mr. Devereaux the mandate is that things should be operated more like a business. Chair Bagley added that he would like to see the actual revenue stream and that CNO appears to be the money maker that subsidizes the other Airports. Mr. Jenkins responded that the Commission will see what is prepared prior to submittal to the Board but will not have the opportunity to comment on adjustments as it will be fixed in the County process. Mr. Jenkins explained that the Department has a new Analyst who will be going on medical leave on or around May 12, 2012 for six to eight weeks and will return at the first quarter of the budget adjustments. Mr. Jenkins added that the Commission will likely be engaged to take a look at the budget as first quarter adjustments are made. Vice Chair Asmus recommended revising the financial statements to be simple and more transparent as they have been difficult to understand. Mr. Jenkins explained his plans for a simpler financial report.

Discussion ensued between Chair Bagley and Mr. Jenkins regarding water quality fines being imposed on the Department by the State of California Water Board. Chair Bagley stated that due to the financial constraints of the County the Department really needs to "be on top" of the deadlines. Mr. Jenkins agreed.

Mr. Stover commented that "his hat goes off" to Mr. Jenkins. Mr. Stover added that over the last few years the Airport staff has basically been cut in half, the budget has been cut back and that Mr. Jenkins has a tough road ahead directing the Department. Mr. Stover stated that a few notices of violations have been received recently and that some of these permitting agencies are seeking revenue. Mr. Stover referred to a recent notice of violation for the Needles Airport (EED) by the Mojave Desert Air Quality Management District (MADQMD) for pump inspections that were not previously done. Commissioner Cable responded that "they are hitting all the airports". Mr. Stover commented that he thinks Mr. Jenkins is doing a great job. Chair Bagley responded that he is sympathetic to the staff due to the cutbacks and he feels like the Department is "riding a disaster" related to Airport revenue. Chair Bagley stated there is a realization for him that the airport he ties down at (TNP) does not pay for itself and that seems to be the case with most County airports. Chair Bagley suggested the Department needs to become more businesslike in how it generates revenue. Mr. Ursic commented that a proactive position with the Regional Water Board is always better in regards to fines.

**Monthly Reports – James E. Jenkins, Director of Airports:**

Monthly report was included in packet but not discussed.

**Date, Time and Place of Next Meeting**

The next meeting will be held on Thursday, May 24, 2012 at 10:00 a.m. at County of San Bernardino, Department of Airports, 777 E. Rialto Avenue, San Bernardino, CA 92415.

Chair Bagley proposed that the Commission look at the calendar and schedule meetings at the actual Airports rather than the Admin Office. Vice Chair Asmus agreed. Mr. Jenkins responded that Wild Willie's Smokehouse would like to host a meeting in June or July, 2012. Chair Bagley requested an agenda item to determine dates and meeting locations. Commissioner Cable offered to host a meeting at the Cable Airport if there was interest in how the private sector operates for comparison.

**Adjournment:** Chair Bagley adjourned the meeting at 11:21 a.m.

## MONTHLY REPORT – CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS May 2012 Update

**TO: AIRPORT COMMISSIONERS**

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The following is an update on major Capital Improvement Projects underway at County airports:

### **APPLE VALLEY AIRPORT**

**Fueling Facility:** Project plans are 100% complete. A Board of Supervisors item will be forthcoming to gain approval of releasing the project for bid.

**Gate Access Upgrade:** Completed.

**Land Acquisition for Runway 18 RPZ:** Board authorized Real Estate Services on September 27, 2011 to move forward toward acquiring two properties partially underlying the Runway Protection Zone for Runway 18. One property owner is amenable to appraised value, but the other property owner requested a higher price, thus triggering eminent domain proceedings.

### **BARSTOW-DAGGETT AIRPORT**

**Electrical Improvements Phase II:** Replacement of at-grade conduit and cabling with underground wiring. A pre-construction meeting was held March 22 at the airport. The contractor was advised to go ahead and order materials for the project by a Notice of Procurement.

### **CHINO AIRPORT**

**Roof Repairs to the Commercial Hangar Complex:** The on-call Job Order Contractor in process on the gutters and roof, but the platforms will not be constructed at this time. Estimated completion: June 1.

**Chlorinated Solvent Plume Environmental Mitigation:** Monitoring and evaluation are continuing by Tetra Tech, Inc. A historical site assessment is being performed by History Associates. Past records of tenants are under review for potentially responsible parties. Six (6) new wells to be drilled at Prado Regional Park are in formal bid process until June 7. An additional eight (8) wells on private properties scheduled to begin construction May 14.

**Storm Water Management:** Bid set of drawings & specifications are being finalized for the basin construction project.

**Northwest Apron Rehabilitation:** (\*\*NEW\*\*) Budgeted for \$150,000 and to be performed by Job Order Contractor as soon as their forces are available. Not a full replacement, but tailored to meet the safety concerns and available budget.
