

Report Notes and Summary

Reported prices for commodities are F.O.B. from the shipping point or packing house, or the equivalent price at the first delivery point. All data is for gross production and prices are the average received. Commodities produced by fewer than three growers have been placed in the miscellaneous category for the commodity group unless permission has been given otherwise. Numbers have been rounded at the first level of compilation (District reports).

FIELD CROPS: Greenchop crops declined because harvested acreage was ensiled to improved their nutritional value. This acreage is reported in Miscellaneous. In addition, the cool Spring weather delayed sudan planting, leading to a reduction in the number of cuttings and production per acre. The value of dry range returned to a traditional carrying capacity as normal levels of rainfall were received.

VEGETABLE CROPS: Despite a slight increase in planted acreage, Oriental vegetables declined in value from the record levels of 1998 as prices in general for these crops were lower. Prices for other crops were generally higher as growers were able to take advantage of the cool, long spring which delayed production elsewhere in California. The production of sweet corn, a warm-season crop was delayed a bit by the cool weather leading to a slight reduction in yields.

FRUIT AND NUT CROPS: Growers reported less grape acres harvested for wine and more harvested for by-products such as juice and raisens. Prices for grape by-products fell substantially from the previous year causing a significant decline in the overall value of production. Navel and Valencia orange prices rose dramatically due to a shortage of fruit produced elsewhere. This shortage caused the orange by-product price to rise as well. Strawberry production increased as the long cool Spring extended the production period by two months. Prices remained good and a significant portion of the crop was marketed directly to consumers.

LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY: Milk production returned to normal levels but prices fell resulting in a slight decrease in value from 1998. The number of dairies and cows decreased as dairies relocated out of the County. Additional chickens at existing ranches increased egg production. Reported ostrich production was down significantly. Pork production remained depressed as a result of low prices. Turkey production ceased near the end of the year.

NURSERY PRODUCTS: Turf production returned to normal after a very slow year in 1998. Bedding plant production also resumed after cessation in mid-1998. Greenhouse area devoted to Indoor decoratives was recalculated. Overall, nursery product sales are starting to show the effects of the rejuvenated economy. indoor decorative production is already maximized for the available greenhouse space and little change occurred from 1998.
