TEAM incorporates 6 pillars of progress to keep track of overall outcome of the program. TEAM is comprised of partners within the community. The program is designed to assist at a youth level to promote contributing individuals into society. This will be an added benefit to community resources. Currently, they have teamed up with Young Visionaries, Rialto Health Services and Probation to name a few of the organizations. TEAM is currently the only program offering Prop 47 to youth.
