| <p>Community Reports</p> | <p>C. Community Reports CA State University Reentry Initiative</p> <p>Ric stated that their 4 centers are full and they serving 450 people per day. The trends seen are that 13% client population are women, several of them are long time offenders. Long time offenders have different needs as not one thing is the same from them. When they leave the institution everything is different for them. The adjustment period can be rough and a good support network is important.</p> <p>Center for Employment Training (CET)</p> <p>They have been providing services for 51 years and currently have 13 centers, their newest center is in Colton. They have 6 technical programs, including automotive specialist HVAC technician, truck driver, welding, automotive specialist and green building construction. They have day and evening classes. They offer Title IV funding, 99% qualify for Pell grants and the rest would be student loans. They do not have to have a high school diploma. While in class whatever they need to help them complete the program they will help them. 70% is reentry population. Their mission is mission is to help people become self-sufficient and get off social services. They have a 91% placement rate.</p> <p>S.T.A.R.T Program</p> <p>They are now in all 4 jails. Contacts are 90% inmate requested, so they are requesting the services themselves. In July & August made approximately 400 contacts. They were able to house direct from custody 11. Had their first official inmate graduation, she graduated and her goal is to get her kids back. There are two individuals that are ready to graduate.
